This course was developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to train renovation, repair and painting contractors how to work, safely in housing with lead-based pain and complies with the EPA's Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule, and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule. It also meets the new EPOA criteria for the policy that takes effect April, 2010. Courses are approved for purposes of certification under Section 402 of TSCA for the respective discipline. This training is required for any contractor involved in any renovations who work in pre-1978 housing and child-occupied facilities, including: renovation contractors, maintenance workers in multi-family housing, painters and other specialty trades. Under the rule, child-occupied facilities are defined as residential, public or commercial buildings where children under age six are present on a regular basis. The requirements apply to renovation, repair or painting activities. The rule does not apply to minor maintenance or repair activities where less than six square feet of lead-based paint is disturbed in a room or where less than 20 square feet of lead-based paint is disturbed on the exterior. Window replacement is not minor maintenance or repair. Please visit www.epa.gov/lead/pubs/renovation.htm for specific regulations. 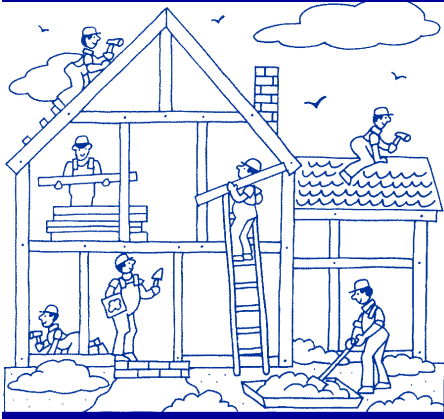

Are You Required To Be Certified?

Be sure your company is in compliance with the EPA's Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair and Painting Program (RRP)

Who must follow the 2008 Lead Rule's Requirements?

In general, anyone who is paid to perform work that disturbs paint in housing and child-occupied facilities built before 1978, this may include, but is not limited to:

- * General Contractors
- * Special Trade Contractors, Including:
 - Painters
 - Plumbers
 - Carpetners
 - Electricians
 - HVAC
- * Residential rental property owners/managers

What activities are subject to the Lead Renovation, Repair And Painting Program?

In general, any activity that disturbs paint in pre-1978 housing and child-occupied facilities, including:

- * Remodeling and repair/Maintenance
- * Electrical work
- * Plumbing
- * Painting
- * Carpentry
- * Window Replacement
- * HVAC installation/replacement

What is the Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair and Painting Program (RRP)?

- The Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Repair and Painting Program is a federal regulatory program affecting contractors, property managers, and others who disturb painted surfaces.
- It applies to residential houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities such as schools and day-care centers built before 1978.
- It includes pre-renovation education requirements as well as training, certification, and work practice requirements.

Pre-renovation education requirements are now effective

- Contractors, property managers, and others who perform renovations for compensation in residential houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities built before 1978 are required to distribute a lead pamphlet before starting renovation work.

Training, certification, and work practice requirements became effective April 22, 2010:

- Firms are required to be certified, their employees must be trained in use of lead-safe work practices, and lead-safe work practices that minimize occupants' exposure to lead exposure to lead hazards must be followed.
- Renovation is broadly defined as any activity that disturbs painted surfaces and includes most repair, remodeling and maintenance activities, including window replacement.
- The program includes requirements implementing both Section 402(c) and 406(b) of the Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA). (www.epa.gov/lead/pubs/titleten.html)
- EPA's lead regulations can be found at 40CFR Part 745, Subpart E.
